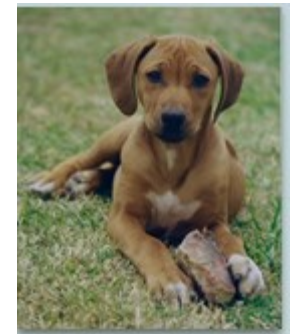

- ⇒ Poisoned rats do not die in bait boxes
- ⇒ Rats can remove poisons from the bait boxes

had ingested poisonous rodent bait that had been carried by an animal from a neighbor's yard into ours. Poisons do not stay in one place. They get carried around and are a threat to our children, pets, and wildlife."

CHECKLIST

Keep out unwanted guests

- ⇒ Seal up your home
- ⇒ Trim fruit trees and clean up fallen fruit
- ⇒ Clean up garbage areas and do not overfill the bins on trash day
- ⇒ Clean up spilled food from bird feeders and place trays under the feeders
- ⇒ Use alternative traps inside your home (zap traps, snap traps, or live traps)
- ⇒ Use rodent sealed composting bins
- ⇒ **NEVER** use glue traps

DID YOU KNOW?

- ⇒ Rat Poisons endanger 10,000 children every year in the United States
- ⇒ 92% of bobcats, 83% of coyotes, and 94% of the mountain lions studied were exposed to anticoagulant poisons

TYPES OF POISONS

Second-generation and first-generation rodenticides are the **most dangerous** rat poisons.

Second-Generation Anticoagulant Rodenticides (SGARS)

These are the **most dangerous** rat poisons!

- ⇒ Brodifacoum
- ⇒ Difethialone
- ⇒ Difenacoum
- ⇒ Bromadiolone

First-Generation Anticoagulant Rodenticides (FGARS)

- ⇒ Diphacinone
- ⇒ Clorophacinone
- ⇒ Warfarin

Other dangerous rodent poisons

- ⇒ Zinc Phosphide
- ⇒ Bromethalin (no antidote)
- ⇒ Cholecalciferol (Vitamin D3—no antidote)
